Go 6.1 miles and turn RIGHT onto Jennings Chapel Road.  
Go 1.6 miles and bear left to stay on Jennings Chapel Road. (Daisy Road will go straight)  
Go 0.4 miles to 3749 on the right..... there will be signs and/or someone to direct you to either 3749 or 3727 (the next house down) according to the weather.

#### **From Frederick:**

Take I-70 E toward Baltimore.

### **New Business**

- Pres. Taylor: Club Officer Election ballots will be printed in the newsletter. Completed Ballots are to be submitted to the club Secretary.
- G. Mele: Bill Wilson is unable to attend today's meeting due to a dialysis appointment. He regrets not being able to see everyone.  
George has been in conversation with past MVPA President and current MVPA Board member David Welch regarding vehicle judging at the Rally. Mr. Welch has been very helpful with judging at past Rally's. The matter of adopting the MVPA judging standards was discussed. Mr. Welch is willing to bring in several impartial MVPA judges to help with this effort. The approach would be to start small and build on this concept. He would also be able to provide mass advertising. This in turn may bring in more high quality restorations. Any restored vehicle earning a national MVPA certificate could possibly be more valuable at time of resale, or just to carry bragging rights. The newsletter will carry this proposal to the members for their opinions.  
Tim Ketchum: Is there a fee to the club for these MVPA judges? G. Mele to

confirm that it would only be honorary.

Clive Rowley: Who pays for the national advertising in the MVPA publication?

G. Mele: Mr. Welch would cover this expense. He would also generate an article to explain the Club's involvement in this process.

- Pres. Taylor read a request for donation letter from member Tony Ankrom. The donation would be applied to a memorial for Navy ship LST-325. This effort is centered around the historical significance of the ship and its part in the war effort.
- Bob Buker spoke about the next club trail ride coming up in late July or early August. This is going to be an overnight event. It will start out at Clive's house and travel secondary roads in the Frederick & Thurmont area. The participants will stay in cabins which will cost \$30.00 a night. He requested that the club pay for the cabins instead of gasoline. A motion to spend funds not to exceed \$300.00 was made, seconded and carried. Trip details to be published in the next newsletter.
- Pres. Taylor discussed the possibility of moving the Rally. One possibility is the Frederick Co Va. Fairgrounds. The cost is \$2000.00 and they would like to host the Rally. It is all grass so we would need volunteerism and planning.  
Denis Mengele: The Intermont MV Club functions in that region and could be asked to help in the effort.
- **Tom B.: Is scheduled to meet with the mayor of Aberdeen in June. They will be talking about renegotiating the 2013 leasing fees. The pattern for the club has been to keep about \$2000.00 after each Rally. He commented that we usually sell**
- 600 spaces at \$60.00 to equal \$36,000.00 income and spend \$34,000.00. in 2012, we sold 530 spaces so income was not at normal levels.
- Denis Mengele: He commented on the visit he and Dean Hansen made to the Martins Airport site. It is 12 miles from Aberdeen. It is all grass, fenced, near some water, no electricity.
- Tim Clark: Commented on the Army Heritage & Education Center near Carlisle PA. This site houses full sized military dioramas and displays from different eras. They have an established website and emailing list that can be used to advertise the Rally. He and John Pasquale toured the site recently. The lease fee is \$4000.00. The people who manage this site have made plans to set up a similar layout for another event to run concurrent with the Rally. This would reduce the amount of planning and set up required. This would include port-a-pots, golf carts, food service, vendor areas, visitor parking and event transportation. The site is located along Route 81, a major interstate road.
- Peter Lee: Suggested gathering up all the different site possibilities and poll the vendors to get their feedback.
- Pres. Taylor: Presented a motion to move the Rally to Carlisle PA in 2013, if Tim and John are willing to lead this effort. The motion was seconded.
- Discussion: Several members spoke about not making this change too soon without further research. Most in attendance agreed.
- President Taylor: Presented an amended motion to form a committee to investigate moving the Rally to Carlisle PA. in 2014. The motion was seconded and carried by the members present. Tim C. , John P. and George Mele agreed to further investigate this for the club.
- The door prize drawing was held and the shirt was won by Clive Rowley.

**National Memorial Day Parade**

**Washington, DC**

**May 28, 2012**

The Washington Area Collectors of Military Vehicles / Blue & Gray Military Vehicle Trust along with the Intermont Military Vehicle Club and several independent military vehicle owners participated with 18 vehicles in the National Memorial Day Parade down Constitution Ave in Washington, DC. This parade started up again 8 years ago after many decades of no parade in D.C. and the club has participated in each one beginning the Monday after the dedication of the National World War 2 Memorial in 2004. As in the past, the parade organizers asked us to carry different veteran's groups and we were honored to do so. The groups we carried this year were 3 Tuskegee airmen, 6 members of the 99<sup>th</sup> Division from WW2, a contingent of Buffalo Soldiers, and several WW2 Philippine soldiers sponsored by the Philippine Embassy. We also carried 3 local ladies, Swing Shift, who sang WW2 era songs along the parade route. One of the jeeps carried Joe Mantegna, a TV personality and co-host of the parade.

The parade started at 7<sup>th</sup> St on Constitution Ave and proceeded along the National Mall to 17<sup>th</sup> St. There were over 100 bands, floats and other entries in the parade. The Parade Grand Marshal was General Chuck Yeager. The weather was clear but hot with the temperature over 90 degrees at parade time. The crowd was very appreciative of our vehicles and very enthusiastic when the veterans passed in review. The parade was televised live on the local Fox channel with a rebroadcast on the Pentagon channel later in the day. The TV coverage was good; however with repeated breaks for commercials, many participants did not get on TV. Fortunately this year all our military vehicles got on TV, some for more time than others.

There were several other military vehicle groups in the parade not participating with our club. There were about 7 vehicles, jeeps and 2 1/2 ton trucks, with the Republic of Vietnam Veterans Assoc. and 4 WW2 jeeps with the Airman's Preservation Society.

This was again another very successful parade. We felt privileged to be able to carry some of our veterans and have them honored. We look forward to participating in next year's parade.
